You may have heard that our 10 Catholic schools earned the distinction as a *system of excellence* by the AdvancED international accrediting agency. We are so proud of our students, teachers, and administrators who work diligently each day to be worthy of such an honor. While there is much more to share from the findings of the AdvancED External Review Team, here are a few commendations received by our schools.

- 1) **Scholars:** The review team conducted 89 classroom observations and found that our classrooms provide challenging and equitable learning opportunities for children. Our students are actively engaged in supportive and well-managed learning environments with teachers who closely monitor student growth. We are preparing Scholars!
- 2) **Leaders:** The diocese and the schools were recognized for strong leadership capacity. Leadership is promoted, not only at the school administration level, but through the teachers and staff as well. School leaders are supported by leadership through active Pastors and parish communities, advisory school boards, and at the diocesan level. While scoring well above average in academics and leadership, the review team did find that our schools were below average in resource utilization. This means that our schools, with your help, are able to do more with less and optimize available resources to achieve outstanding performance!

I join with our parishes and each of your Catholic school communities in joyful celebration and prayerful thanksgiving for the great work that has been done, and the continued commitment of our school leaders, faculty members, and school families in helping make our schools places of excellence.
